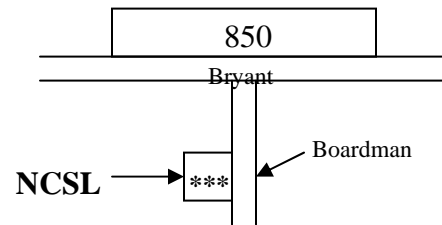

For all DMV matters, make an appointment online or by calling the number above. To get your Driver's License or ID card, you will need to complete an application form (form DL 44), provide your social security number (bring your Social Security Card, if you have it), show proof of birth date and legal presence (bring birth certificate and/or passport), and pay the application fee (\$27 for replacement driver's license, \$22 for ID card). For your ID card, you will also have your thumbprint and picture taken. Your card will be mailed within 60 days.

Services address issues related to homelessness, case management, crisis intervention, housing assistance, money management, food, clothing, psychiatric needs, substance abuse, legal assistance, medical needs, public benefits, ID, and financial assistance. Call for an appointment or drop-in to be seen on a first come, first served basis. St. Anthony Foundation also has a food pantry, a dining room, alcohol and drug recovery services, a clothing and furniture program, a learning center and employment program, a medical clinic, senior outreach and support services, and a shelter for homeless women.
